In the 1830's, Vice-Admiral FitzRoy, the famous sailor and meteorologist, mounted a stormglass on the mast of the HMS Beagle. During that voyage, FitzRoy carefully documented how the stormglass predicted the weather.

MARINER'S STORMGLASS

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- LIQUID CLEARING, THE WEATHER WILL BE BRIGHT AND CLEAR.
- LIQUID CLOUDING, THE WEATHER WILL BE CLOUDY, PERHAPS WITH RAIN.
- SMALL DOTS ACCUMULATING IN LIQUID, THE WEATHER WILL BE HUMID OR FOGGY.
- CLOUDY LIQUID WITH SMALL STARS ACCUMULATING INDICATES THUNDERSTORMS.
- SMALL STARS GATHERING ON SUNNY WINTER DAYS IS A SIGN OF SNOW COMING.
- LARGE FLAKES BUILDING INDICATES OVERCAST IN SUMMER, SNOW IN WINTER.
- CRYSTALS BUILDING AT THE BOTTOM POINTS TO FROST IN WINTER.
- IF THERE ARE THREADS NEAR THE TOP, IT WILL BE WINDY.

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
