



Rules

Object:

Get your color to reach the other end of the game unit by saying words that match the category.

Let's Play!

Players position themselves at either end of the GibGab game unit, facing each other. Select a category from one of the cards. Or come up with your own category, like "Dad's Food Fails" or "Mom's Short-Lived Hobbies"!

Press the orange button to turn on the game unit. Decide which player will go first. The first player begins the game by saying a word that matches the chosen category and then pressing their button. The button may not be pressed until a word is said. As soon as they press their button, the lights of their color begin to move toward their opponent.

Quick! Now it's the other player's turn to say a word that matches the category, press their button, and send their color moving back toward the first player! Play continues until one player's color reaches the



other end of the game unit.
That player wins the round!

Winning the Game:

At the end of each round, the game unit will display the score. The first player to score three points wins the game!

Challenge:

If a player says a word that doesn't fit the category OR has already been said, the other player may challenge them by saying, "Challenge!" and pressing their button.

Three Levels of Difficulty:

The switch underneath the game unit lets you choose between three levels of difficulty: Easy (2 seconds per light), Hard (1.5 seconds per light), or INSANE (1 second per light).

- Game unit will turn off automatically after one minute of inactivity.
- To refresh the points and restart the game, simply turn the game unit off by pressing the orange button and then turn it back on.
- Game unit requires 3 AAA batteries, not included.
